

Share how FFA helped you grow as a person:


Share how FFA helped you grow as a person:





MINNESOTA FARMER WINS NATIONAL CULVER'S CONTEST

The **To Farmers with Love Contest** is an award presented annually by Culver's to deserving farmers across the United States. This year's grand prize winner went to Jeannette Sheehan from Rochester, Minnesota. She received the grand prize of \$5,000 to use on her farm along with an additional \$5,000 to donate to an FFA Chapter of her choice. She selected the Northfield FFA chapter that chartered last year.

Chris Holz and his daughter Jaelyn nominated Jeannette for this award because of the profound impact she has had on their family. Jeannette leases around 25 animals to youth, including Jaelyn of Northfield, in southeast Minnesota to show at their local county fair.

"Jeannette has been so willing to allow these 4-H members, all pretty much from the city, to get a taste of agriculture," said Chris

The Holzes are just one example of the amazing impact the leasing program has on youth of all ages and backgrounds. Nominating Jeannette was an easy choice for Jaelyn and Chris.

"She has done so much for agriculture by volunteering her time to do everything she can for the future generation," said Jaelyn.

"She expects nothing in return. She's doing this for the future," Jaelyn added.

Jeannette and her husband Robert own and operate Sheeknoll Farms near Rochester, milking 55 cows there plus another 250 cows on a second farmsite with Sheehan family partners and crop farming 900 acres. Sheeknoll Farms show their animals competitively and lease their best animals to 4-H and FFAmembers. For Jeannette, it's not just about the showring.

"These kids are going to be running companies," said Jeannette. "They're going to be farming. They are going to be making laws and rules for us for the future. You want to make sure that they have this experience to see the whole picture."

Now because of the 4-H lease program many of them want to go into an agriculture-related field

The money Jeannette donated to the Northfield FFA will be used for a community service project.

"Jaelyn's passion and pursuit in the dairy industry and heart to give to others is the reason for receiving this grand award,"said T.J. Austin, Northfield FFA Chapter advisor. "I am excited to see what she comes up with as a service project for the FFA Chapter. Thank you to Jeannette for thinking of our chapter, and, yet again, continuing to invest in our youth's future!"

For many youth across the Midwest who have had the opportunity to show dairy cattle for the Sheehans, it has been more than just showing dairy cattle. It is about the community in agriculture they have been able to find through it.

The Holz family is just one story of the countless youth she has made an impact on.

Jeannette is one shining volunteer example who invests in our youth and makes agriculture and our communities brighter and better.







FROM RELUCTANT STUDENT TO PASSIONATE EDUCATOR: ONE AG TEACHER'S JOURNEY

Rachel Moe // Agricultural Education Instructor, Red Rock Central

For many **agricultural education instructors**, the road to the classroom begins on a farm or in an FFA jacket. But for this educator, it started with resistance—and a little parental push.

"I grew up on a corn and soybean farm, and we've since added beef cattle," Rachel Moe, an agricultural education instructor at Red Rock Central, said. "But when it came time to sign up for ag classes in high school, I wanted no part of it."

Despite her roots in agriculture, ag class wasn't on her radar—until her parents and a determined ag teacher, Nate Thompson, made the decision for her.

What started as a reluctant placement turned into a passion.

As she moved through high school, specialized courses and involvement in FFA and 4-H helped her discover not just a love for agriculture, but also a calling to teach.

"I always knew I wanted to be a teacher, but it was through those organizations that I realized agricultural education was the right fit," Rachel said.

She pursued her degree at South Dakota State University and now teaches in a single-teacher program—an environment full of rewards and challenges.

"The most rewarding part of my job is seeing students have those 'aha' moments—especially the tough ones. I've had seniors come up before graduation to say thank you, and I think back to who they were in 8th or 9th grade, and it's incredible to see how far they've come," she said.

Those connections continue long after graduation."I love seeing where life takes them—on social media or in person. Whether they go into agriculture or not, knowing they found something meaningful in my classroom is the best reward," she said.

But the job isn't without its challenges.

"The hardest part is time—balancing everything in a oneteacher program," she said. "If it's ag or FFA-related, it comes to me. There are only so many hours in the day."

> Support has made a difference. Early in her career, she leaned on veteran teachers, conferences, and state networks.

"There is real value in attending conferences and workshops that are offered at the state level. These offer not only content resources that are needed in the classroom, but also you are able to connect with

teachers from across the state who are very like minded. Teachers

that have probably been in many of the same situations and can help along the way," she said.

"The Ag Teacher Network is really something special. I have had administrators say about how they thought it cool to see the connections we have and teachers supporting each other. During the first few years, I also leaned on mentors locally as well. Every school is different so learning the systems at each place can take time to adiust."

Her advice for those considering this path? "If you want something fast-paced where no two days are the same, and you want to inspire kids, go for it. You never know—ag might not be in your plans now, but one day you might be an ag teacher yourself."








A new scholarship was recently announced by the Minnesota FFA Foundation. For the first time, the Jim and Donna Thiher Scholarship was awarded to two students during the Minnesota State FFA Convention. Each scholarship is \$2,500 and is renewable.

CHAPTER IS ONE OF **FOUR NEW CHARTERS**

In Monticello, an FFA chapter has been reborn.

Having disappeared in the 80s, the chapter is among four that received their charters at the 2025 State FFA Convention.

The other chartering chapters were **Hope Lutheran FFA** in Winona, Dilworth-Glyndon-Felton FFA and Hendricks FFA.

It was the effort of students like seniors John Payne, Lea Hanson and Elliot Sala that led the Monticello district to allocate a half-time teacher and several agriculture, food and natural resource classes in the 2024-2025 school year. Plans are in place for a full-time teaching and advising position next fall.

The man filling the position, Jacob Wilts, graduated from Monticello High School during the time FFA did not exist there. He moved from the Buffalo, Minnesota, school district to take the reins of the new chapter.

"This whole senior class (of FFA members) had been asking why we couldn't have FFA," Wilts said. "They made the case that if the school wanted something to prepare students for real life, FFA was it.'

Payne, the chapter president, said he was motivated to push for the new opportunity after hearing the school board was thinking about the possibility of adding AFNR classes and FFA. It wasn't long before he was leading the chapter.

"None of us (students) really knew what we were doing, but we made it work," he said. Hanson, the chapter vice president, wanted to earn a high school letter. FFA provided her that opportunity. FFA meant Sala. His team was one of six from the chapter that qualified for state Career Development Event competition.


The Monticello chapter already has an active alumni group headed by Pete Eiden, whose daughter was advised by Wilts during his Buffalo employment. "(Jacob) asked me just after he was hired whether I would come on board," Eiden said. "I'm very happy I did. The support griculture from the community, parents and past FFA members is just phenomenal." "The hunger for ag education in Monticello was very, very strong—both from the students and the past members," he added.

Wilts and Eiden are excited by the success of the chapter's first year.

"The fact that we have 25 or 30 active members, and we did it in six months is just unbelievable," Wilts said. "And we have lots of room for growth."

That growth may come from recruiting by those senior FFA members. Open enrollment from neighboring districts also looks promising.

Payne, Hanson and Sala are headed off to college soon— Hanson to Montana for equine studies, Sala to South Dakota State University for animal science and Payne to Lake Superior College for aviation—with their FFA experience to help them succeed in their future endeavors.




The 2025 Minnesota FFA Communications Team played a vital role in amplifying the excitement and impact of the Minnesota FFA State Convention.



EDRIC FUNK'S JOURNEY FROM MINNESOTA FFA TO THE TORO COMPANY




The alignment between The Toro Company's values and FFA's mission is a key reason why the company continues to support the Minnesota FFA Association.


